



I am an Italian architect and **Assistant Professor** at Politecnico di Milano - DAStU - Dipartimento d'Eccellenza [2018-2022 e 2023-2027].

I hold my doctorate with honors in Architectural and Urban Design (Politecnico di Milano 2016), with a thesis titled *Architectures through Time: Project, Memory, Transformation.* After graduating in 2008 with my master's degree in architecture, I have constantly conducted extensive *research to enhance architectural and historical heritage* (Graduate School of Conservation of Architectural and Landscape Heritage, Politecnico di Milano, 2009-2011)

I deepened my research on similar topics through periods abroad as a **visiting Ph.D.** at the University Of California - Berkeley (USA, 2013) and Oxford Brookes University (UK, 2014).

Since 2017 I have been an **Adjunct Professor at Politecnico di Milano**, where I am working in collaboration with, partaking in contract work, research projects (PRIN, FARB, ...), workshops, and international conferences.

I have several international publications, such as books, chapters, journal articles, and conference papers.

In 2019 I won the **International Research and Teaching fellowship at CEPT University - Ahmedabad (India)**, where my research and academic courses have investigated the concept of urban regeneration and resilience in the historic City of Ahmadabad.

In 2019 (till 2022) I became **Post-doctoral Fellow** on the **"Fragilità territoriali"** project at Politecnico di Milano - DAStU - Dipartimento d'Eccellenza [2018-2022], focusing on Architectural Recycle and Re-Use in fragile urban Fabrics and Landscapes. In 2021-2022 I started as **visiting researcher at Fondazione Edmund Mach** (Trento - Italy) to develop joint research between Polimi and FEM concerning the regeneration of underutilized alpine territories for activating resilience processes.

From 2022 to 2024 I am **Associate Researcher at LabiSAlp - Università della Svizzera italiana - Accademia di Architettura** (Mendrisio CH), where my research focuses on the topic of collective ownership applied to spatial relationships and memories in the contemporary Alpine landscape(s).

Moreover, since 2009 I am **architect at Tognon Architetti**, an architecture practice founded by in the Sixties in Bergano and dealing with restoration and architectural design.

The **research activity** focuses on investigating the concept of memory, history, and identity related to the concept of vernacular architecture (case studies: Alpine region, Africa, India). The aim is to understand the *role of memory in modification and transformation processes*. The research is oriented to the interaction between different disciplinary knowledge in urban fabrics and landscapes characterized by under-use, degradation, or abandonment processes. In particular, my research consists of design strategies about recycling and reuse of buildings and territorial resilience.

	<u>Abstract</u> : The research defines the concepts of patrimony and cultural heritage as qualities to be acknowledged by the collective conscience, which is essential to creating whole urban spaces and forms in cities today.
	History is actively involved in the contemporary everyday production of local habits, traditions, and social practices. In the virtue of its durability and ability to survive, Architecture brings memory and traditions of the past alive into the present through spatial transformation, social practice, and the value of historic fabric. This topic's importance is related to the sense of identity, an omnipresent category in the humanities. Identity is anchored in physical space: space offers the strength to access the past. The aim is to understand the role that memory takes in transformation processes, oriented to the interaction between different disciplinary knowledge in contexts that have at their core the relationship between ancient and modern, between preservation and transformation. In these areas, architecture will employ its operational tools to make sense and be able to transform those spaces that contain traces of the past, able to live on in the future. Moreover, the objectives of this research are: how it is possible to build the future through the past and how Memory, History, and Identity can be used as a design strategy for maintaining or developing heritage and the cultural landscape.

Topic: Exploring Urban Voids

<u>Pedagogy:</u> The course starts from the consciousness of the urgent necessity to rethink the complex condition in which cities and territories find themselves today. In fact, in India, as in the rest of the world, we are observing, on the one hand, the progressive urbanization of land and the ongoing process of abandonment of buildings, even recently built; on the other side, the nature of the contemporary urbanization. The course objects are the abandoned urban fabrics or unfinished buildings, no longer congruent with actual uses and new requirements. This status is producing an ordinary landscape of waste inside our cities. A "map of abandoned land" on the Western side of Ahmedabad is necessary to understand the straightforward situation and specify strategies that can address the urgent need to transform these critical territories.

The project's theme concerns tiny modules self-built by the students that prefigure the experimentation of small transportable architectural prototypes.

The workshop's sites are the high-altitude territories of marginal Alpine valleys, where production and traditional economic activities have slowly disappeared, the forest has conquered the pastures, and some buildings timidly withstand the snow and time.

For two weeks, students will work in small teams (2/3 people), close to each other and moving from the design phase (3 days) to the physical realization of the wooden module on a scale of 1:1 (7 days). In line with this, we want to condense in a single experience the immaterial aspects of the creative process and the material aspects of the construction process, enhancing the entire method. The adaptability to the context's different conditions is necessary to promote a design approach that welcomes and graces propulsive thrusts in alpine contexts.

<u>Topic:</u> The Department goal is to establish a transdisciplinary Research Centre of Excellence on territorial fragilities that can become a permanent reference point both in the world of academia and research, and amongst the institutions and other actors involved in the "anti-fragile" policies and projects being developed.

The interdisciplinary and issue-focused nature of the DAStU, as well as its position within a polytechnic university in which other departments can offer complementary expertise on the subject, are the starting points for building a research programme capable of effectively integrating the geographical/environmental and socio-economic dimensions of territorial fragilities.

The programme's research activities cover aspects related to policies and projects for the reuse, recycling and regeneration of the historical, cultural, architectural, landscape and built environment heritage, but also the actions required to reduce the social and territorial disparities and inequalities between different areas of the country as well as between different portions of urbanised areas. Since 2018, the DAStU activated 16 three-year research grants for different disciplinary areas to create a group of qualified and highly motivated young researchers to work on the programme, including with a synergistic and integrated approach.

<u>Research Line:</u> ReArch - Architectural recycling and reuse. Descriptive methodologies and design strategies in urban fabrics and fragile landscapes.

The ongoing research investigates how in the light of profound changes due to changes in economic, socio-cultural and migratory flows, the phenomenon of depopulation and the abandonment of territories with historical-identity value is crucial today. This phenomenon occurs not only within the European territory (e.g. inner areas of Italy or regions of Greece, Portugal or Spain).

The objects of this investigation are the "fragile territories", or the "neglected territories" in the Italian Alpine regione. However, they are the places where historically communities have expressed themselves in a different relationship between urban dimension and territory. Therefore, they are spaces that 'quietly' hold an invaluable cultural heritage.
